

Support for People living with Diabetes affected by the Situation in Ukraine

Dear IDF Europe Members,

To support people living with diabetes affected by the situation in Ukraine, we are currently working with our member associations in Ukraine and in neighbouring countries. Together with them, we have identified the need for an online platform where Ukrainian refugees can find immediate information on how and where to receive support. To provide this space, **we have set up the website “[Connect Solidarity](#)”**. On this platform, we are gathering **information to help Ukrainian refugees living with diabetes** to understand what support they can get **in the country where they are**, and how to get it. To do this, we are developing **dedicated country pages** to be published in English and Ukrainian, detailing information such as how to register to obtain medicines and supplies, where to find information (e.g., diabetes associations contacts, helplines, etc.).

To support this effort, we would like to kindly ask you to share any information you might have regarding Ukrainian refugees in the country in which your association operates.
